Fact Sheet: Conflict Resolution in Special Education

- 1. Reduce opportunities for conflict to arise. Practice excellent communication skills when partnering with your school team. Share your concerns and ideas clearly verbally and in writing. Fully participate in decision-making and share concerns in a timely manner. PACER Center: https://www.pacer.org/parent/php/PHP-c254.pdf
- Whenever possible, be prepared to offer constructive suggestions and ideas as a member
 of the IEP team. If you need support to participate fully, consider reaching out and

- 3. Consider a Facilitated IEP through the Illinois Board of Education. A trained facilitator will be assigned to assist the team in working together in a positive and productive way.
